Minutes of the April 4th, 2011 NODXA Meeting

The meeting was opened by the President, Tedd, KB8NW, at 7:30pm. There were 20 members and no guests present. After a round of introductions, the minutes of the March 7^{th} meeting were read. After a minor correction, Gary, NI8Z, moved, seconded by Ron, K8VJG, that the minutes be approved. The motion passed. The Treasurer, Mary, N8DMM, reported a balance of Ka-Ching! in the account.

Tedd reported that John, K8YSE, was back from Florida. Tedd also commented that a web page is available for people to relay an emailed letter to their congressional representative explaining our

concerns regarding House Bill HR-607, which would take sizable portions of the 440 MHz band for use by "first responders". The web page is http://www.kd4pyr.net/hamletter.htm. Or you can email to arrl@chwatco.com. Tedd has received a letter from Randy, NOTG, from the group going to Sable Island, acknowledging receipt of our donation check. Denny, WB8K, reported a rumor of the possible sale of the "pole" which hosts our repeater. Dave, WD8IOU, reported that the next newsletter is in progress.

Old - New Business

Tedd requested a motion to accept the previously nominated officers. Pete, N8TR, moved, seconded by Dave, WD8IOU, that the nominated slate of 2011-2012 officers be elected. The motion passed.

Dwaine, K8ME, asked if anyone was interested in ARRL 2011 Field Day T-shirts. The cost is \$12.50 each. A sheet was passed around for anyone interested to sign up to be on the shirt order. Money will be collected at the next meeting. Dwaine also announced that the club-sponsored ARRL International DX Contest, Single Operator, Assisted Phone, Great Lakes Division plaque had been funded for 2012. Pete, N8TR, won the plaque last year.

Rick, K8ZH, moved, seconded by Pete, N8TR, that the club donate \$100.00 to the group forming the upcoming DXpedition 4W6A, Atauro Island, Timor Leste, (formerly East Timor) on September 16th to the 26th. The motion passed.

Tedd reported that Lee Wical, KH6BZF, has made DXCC Honor Roll after 35 years of DXing, . Dave, WD8IOU, reported that the NODXA special event honoring 20 years and the 1000th edition of the OPDX Bulletin was a great success. Approximately 900 QSOs were made. Among the operators were Dave, WD8IOU; Tedd, KB8NW; John, K8YSE; Dwaine, K8ME; and Ron, K8VJG. A number of DX QSOs were logged in the event. Tedd has already received 60 QSL cards. TNX reply cards are being sent out. Dave described that during that event the RF from his linear arced over his coax switch.

George, K8KR, mentioned reports that shipments from Yaesu and other Japanese manufacturers will be delayed in varying degrees, because of the earthquake. Pete, N8TR, reported that Hal, W1NN, from Medina, was in Tokyo during the earthquake and experienced the buildings swaying. Kan Mizoguchi, JA1BK, emailed Tedd and reported being safe.

Per Tedd's request, Dave, WD8IOU, moved, and Carl, K8AV seconded, that \$250.00 be appropriated for food and beverages for the Dayton hospitality suite. The motion passed. Dwaine, K8ME, reported that seats for the chartered CARS Dayton bus were filling up. A fee of \$40. per seat must be paid by May 3rd. Reservations and payment via PayPal may be made via www.2cars.org. Dwaine also reminded everyone of the bus trip to ARRL Headquarters scheduled for July 17th departure, payable the same way.

Minutes of the May 2nd, 2011 NODXA Meeting

President Tedd, KB8NW, opened the meeting at 7:30pm, 22 members and no guests present. After a round of introductions, the minutes for April 4th were read. After a minor correction, Ron, K8VJG moved, seconded by Pete, N8TR, that the minutes be approved. The motion passed. The Treasurer, Mary, N8DMM, reported a balance of \$Ka-Ching! in the account. Mary also said that dues are again now due.

Old - New Business

Tedd commented that he has not yet sent the letter to the 4W6A DXpedition team.

On Tedd's question regarding the status of the 147.36 repeater, members remarked that it is still operational. The pole was safe after our high winds of April 28. There is an engineering report out on the strength of the pole. Glenn, AF8C, reported that weak signals result in background static in the repeater output. Denny, WB8K, explained that new cell telephone hardware near club's repeater antenna may have caused some detuning and corrections are in order. Dave, WD8IOU, reported that the next newsletter is in work. He requests any information pertinent to the Dayton Hamvention. Dave will also include information on the Dayton bus and the ARRL bus trips. Per Dwaine, K8ME, the Dayton bus is now a go, so seats are available until May 20.

Tedd said that the hospitality suite has been reserved by Janeen. The DX Banquet will be held at the Marriott, but the Contest Dinner and the Top Band banquet stay at the Crowne Plaza. About 10 members are planning to go to Dayton. Near the end of the meeting Dwaine mentioned the table where hams can submit email to protest the HR-607 bill. Dwaine has a reply on that from Representative Betty Sutton.

Per Ron, K8VJG, the Field Day site is reserved for NODXA on June 25-26. Bruce, N8DJX, said he will acquire the liability insurance for that weekend. Discussion started on radios to use. Nick, N8XD, and Jim, K8MR, would be on CW with the best possible radios. The Phone station needs a comparable radio. Dave, WD8IOU, may have a Yaesu FT990 for the GOTA station if there is going to be a GOTA station.

Per Tedd, the T6 DXpedition has been called off after the recent Middle East news and the death of James McLaughlin, WA2EWE/T6AF, in a meeting room ambush by an Afghan pilot. The club's donation will be refunded. Per Dwaine, Turkmenistan, EZ, will no longer be heard due to their government rescinding all operating permits.

Tedd discussed the virtues of geocaching, a popular new hobby. Jim, KE8G, is heavy into the hobby. Geocaching participants use GPS units to locate articles cached in woods, trees, cliffs, etc. Cuyahoga County Public library has classes on geocaching, with Strongsville on May 25 at 7 p.m., Brooklyn May 18, and Berea on May 5. Jim, KE8G, may be able to give a demonstration of it on Field Day.

Tedd said he would send out the URL for a 30 minute CBS news video on Mt. Athos from the show by reporter Bob Simon on April 24. (http://www.cbs.com/primetime/60_minutes)

George, K8KR, announced a slight postage increase occurred May 1. Postcards up a penny, and mail to Mexico and Canada will cost more. First class one-ounce postage remains at 44 cents. George asked if people would favor having the 8th area bureau switch over to cash only, no envelopes. Perhaps we should discuss this at Dayton with our director.

Bruce, N8DJX, had a Digital Equipment PC computer as a door prize, but after several tickets were drawn, no one wanted the computer for parts or anything. The main raffle drawing for half of

\$37.00 was won by George, K8KR.

Tedd closed the meeting at 8:30 PM.



I'm Going Buggy By Dan Romanchik, KB6NU

Last year at Dayton, I bought a used Vibroplex Original bug for \$50. The stainless steel plating wasn't in the greatest shape, and the silver contacts needed cleaning, but I thought I'd gotten a pretty good deal.

Well, I never could get it to work quite right. I thought it was just that I didn't know how to adjust it properly. Whatever the reason, it just didn't work quite right, so while I played around with it from time to time, it mostly just sat on the bench.

About a month and a half ago, I decided to once and for all to figure out what was going on. I played with the adjustments, but again didn't get good results. I did notice, though, that the contacts

were in really bad condition. It looked as though someone had taken a file to them. That's a real no-no for key contacts.

Fortunately, Vibroplex has a relatively low-cost service for contact replacement. For \$40, they'll send you a complete set of new contacts. There are a couple of caveats, though:

You have to send in two contact posts so that they can replace the contact point on them.

The order form on their website has the wrong address on it.

Both of these issues caused a delay. I first sent the order to the wrong address, and it took a week for the Post Office to return the letter to me. Then, I didn't

understand that I had to send in the posts, so that delayed my order. The second issue was my fault, but the first is Vibroplex's fault.

I finally got that all straightened out, and the parts arrived on Wednesday. I put the bug back together yesterday, and now it works like a charm.

The only problem is that the dits are very fast. I'm going to have to experiment with ways to slow that down. Vibroplex makes a thing called the Vari-Speed that does this, but it costs another \$35, and I'm not sure I want to spend that much more. In any case, I'll be practicing with the bug and hope to "get buggy" on the air soon.

Device Tests PowerPole Outlets By Dan Romanchik, KB6NU

I just found a link to this unique little device and had to blog about it right away. The <u>PowerPole Polarity and Voltage Tester</u> is similar to one of those little devices that you plug into an *AC* outlet that tells you if the outlet is wired correctly. Except that you plug this device into an unknown PowerPole outlet.

What surprised me is that this little device actually uses a microcontroller to measure the voltage. I guess that I really shouldn't be surprised, though. Microcontrollers come in very small packages now, and programming them is very simple to do.



Because microcontroller are programmable, you could extend the functionality of this device. For example, you could add a small alpha-numeric display or more LEDs to indicate different voltage ranges.

While the circuit is very simple, and is easily fabricated on some perfboard, the author of this <u>Instructables</u> project, has

indicated that he intends to make a PC board and kit available. I've e-mailed him about this, and will report on what he has to say about price and availability.

Another thought that occurs to me is that I could make one of these with the Arduino that's been languishing beneath my workbench for the last year or so. Basically, I'd just take the front end circuitry from this project and connect it up to my Arduino. I'd have to do some programming, but I think I can handle that.:)


Ohio QSO Party 2010 DX Award Winner By Uli Ann, DL2HBX


My sincere thanks go to Jörg, DF9LJ, who offered me to operate from his fine station. I hope to be back this summer, from the DX side again.
